It is that time of year again when we would like to make a few reminders pertaining to ordinances in the Village of Elkton. The most common violations that occur are raking leaves/grass into streets. In town, we have road side pickup for yard waste. Just put you leaves/grass clippings into either a biodegradable bag or a garbage can marked with an X and put them to the curb with your regular garbage. Another violation that occurs is illegal burning. In the village, you can only burn between the hours of 6:00 P. M. and Midnight. You cannot burn on the ground other than having a campfire. You cannot burn leaves or grass and any other burning has to be in a barrel at the back of your property. And as a quick reminder, please make sure any vehicles on your property are road worthy. They must be plated, insured and able to be driven down the road legally. We here at the Elkton Police Department want to thank you for all your support and help in keeping the Village of Elkton clean and looking good. Hope Everyone has a great spring and summer.
