Department Reports

Clerk/Treasurer-Phyllis Baranski explained the Headlee Act regarding this year's property taxes. The Auditors will be here in person on May 18th and 19th. John Ferris is still working on the Medical Marijuana Ordinance. Phyllis will schedule an Ordinance committee meeting to review before presenting to Council. The Master Plan Final Copy will be arriving from Spicer Group soon. Phyllis Baranski also reminded the trustees of the thank you letter in their packet from ABATE of Michigan regarding May Motorcycle Awareness month.

Ambulance-Coordinator Beth Swartzendruber-Beth stated five crew members participated in disaster training a week ago on Saturday morning. Beth stated there were 22 runs for April.

Police-Chief Scott Jobes: Scott stated it was a busy weekend with 15 complaints Friday through Sunday. He has had 163 complaints this year compared to 187 last year.

DPW-Superintendent Lonnie Schulz: Lonnie stated he has had both water and sewer visits from DEQ recently. The water tower painting company should be starting their lay down yard soon. The equipment at the East well is holding the pressure in anticipation of the water tower being emptied for painting. The fire department knows about the water tower being painted, so they won't be able to draw water during a large fire. Lonnie stated he has been in contact with Jason Nicol regarding the street projects for this year. Discussion on lagoon compost pile and fertilizer on soccer fields.

Committee Reports:

1. DDA-Phyllis Baranski and Gail Schember gave an update on the Pocket Park, downtown flower pots, new businesses in the downtown, and fundraising ideas for the Pocket Park. Discussion.
