ABOUT ELKTON

Elkton is a small village in the thumb area of Michigan. The Village encompasses 1 square mile, and it provides industrial and some commercial employment for the residents and surrounding area. The property surrounding Elkton is rural and agricultural in nature. The area outside of Elkton is sparsely populated so the parks in Elkton serve, Colfax Township to the East, Chandler Township to the North, Winsor Township to the West and Grant Township to the South. The Village sits in the middle of Oliver Township. State Highway M-142 carries traffic to Elkton from all parts of the county.

According to the 2000 U.S. Census, the population of Elkton is 863. The 2010 Census for the Village of Elkton shows a decrease of approximately 55 people to 808. Other selected demographic data regrading the Village of Elkton is shown below. One interesting piece of data is that Elkton's median age is 36.3 years.

Program Description & Summary

What is the 6-Year Capital Improvement Plan?

The information that follows represents Village of Elkton's 6-Year Capital Improvement Plan. Projects have been identified that need to be addressed over the next six fiscal years. The plan serves as a crucial planning component within the Village's overall operational management structure. The program provides important information that aids in maintaining the Village's critical infrastructure as well as the equipment needed to carry out the delivery of services to the community.

What is a Capital Project?

A capital project has been identified by the Village as any project that exceeds \$5,000 and has an estimated useful life greater than three (3) years. This includes items like ambulance vehicles, DPW trucks, water and sewer extensions, parks and recreation equipment and office equipment. This Capital Improvement Plan identifies those projects that meet the criteria above that will be addressed in the next six years.

How is the Plan Developed?

The Village has a Capital Improvements Planning Committee. Its members include the following: Lonnie Schulz, Phyllis Baranski, and Daniel Armbruster added to the plan where appropriate. Once a final proposed document has been completed, the plan is distributed to the Village Planning Commission for their review and recommendation to the Village Council. The plan will then be submitted to the Village Council meeting, where citizen input will be sought. The Village Board adopts the final version at the annual budget hearing.

How is the 6-Year Capital Improvement Program Organized?

The plan is developed on a departmental basis. Summaries for the overall plan are listed by department in order to help analyze the impact to each fund within the Village. The summaries that follow on the next several pages will highlight the annual cost of projects for each department per year, as well as summarize the sources of funding that have been identified each year to complete the related slate of projects.

Plan Summary

Project Priority

The priority of each project is determined by the funding source and fiscal year these projects are placed in. Each fund prioritized project is independent unless there is potential to cross utilize and leverage funds from multiple sources. This primarily occurs between the water and sewer fund and the major and local street funds, within each fund therefore the earlier the year the project is placed in the fund the higher priority each project has.
